Key Note Address

It's Time to Innovate: Improving Student Data Portability

Greater student mobility, worldwide access to education and rapid technological change have created a new imperative for authorities certifying student progress and program completion. Thomas Black, our key note speaker, argues that it is time to approach our challenges differently, to adopt the new technologies and standards, and to apply them creatively to ensure that our students can compete in a world marketplace for their talents. As it takes time to change conventions throughout the world, Mr. Black argues that bold action by a courageous few is required if we are to serve our students and other constituents properly in the future.



Workshops

ID Management

This workshop will be centred around giving users control over their own personal information, and how federated electronic identity can help to develop an ecosystem that allows for User-controlled disclosure of information. This can happen with information as diverse as educational or medical records.

E-portfolio and Europass

Workshop dealing with the current situation of e-portfolio's development in The Netherlands. The e-portfolio is the depository of student and citizen data (such as diploma data). It is crucial that these portfolios are internationally exchangeable, hence the need for standardization. Standardization can refer to content (for example by using Europass documents) or by agreeing on international standards of exchange. The citizen / student should be the pivot as owner of his own data. This requires a reversal of thinking: from customer Relationship Management (CRM) to Vendor Relationship Management (VRM).
